Addressing objectives

- Remind the provisions of the OIE Chapter 7.7 on stray dog population control;
 - A special presentation and copy of the OIE Chapter is in your folders;
- Review National Control strategies on stray dog population and establish the baseline situation (in terms of compliance with OIE standard) in Balkan countries;
 - A monitoring and evaluation tool has been developed with the idea to measure the progress achieved for defined period of time
 - An afternoon session devoted to countries presentation (*each country will be given 15 time slot to present on the main aspects of the M and E tool*)
 - Discussion on the use of the M and E tool – (countries opinion is important)

Addressing objectives

- Identify the key weaknesses/constraints/challenges in implementation of the OIE standards;
 - Working Group session (*countries will be divided in two groups having 1 hour time*)
 - Reporting and discussion session
- Share best practices of sustainable management of stray dogs in the region;
 - There are 5 key topics in the agenda (*from 1 to 4 topics there will be a general and country experience ppt and for topic 5 two countries experience ppt.*):
 - 1) Designing a modern legislation (OIE and Romania)
 - 2) Identifying the source and monitoring (RSPCA and Slovenia)
 - 3) Improving the level of coordination (VS and municipalities) (France and Bulgaria)
 - 4) Raising public awareness to the general public (RSPCA and Serbia)
 - 5) Communicating VS activities to the general public (Croatia and Germany)

Addressing objectives

- Exchange on a common vision at Sub-Regional level to address the problem with the stray dog population control including its rabies component, with the perspective of a Roadmap to achieve the vision at Sub-Regional level.
 - Working Group Session (*countries will be divided in two groups having 1h15 min time aiming to:*
 - *Discuss and find consent on a common vision*
 - *M & E tool to be used to measure the progress → 6 months period to be completed → 1 year to measure achieved result → 2 years to organise next SDB*
 - *What to do = How = Roadmap (SDB2, SDB3, SDB4 etc.)*
 - *When we could expect to reach the target (define a common target)*
 - Reporting Session
